CITY-WIDE VOLUNTEER DAYS

TOGETHER we made an incredible impact at our city wide volunteer days in April!

14 Cities. 7,000+ Volunteers. 270 projects. 28,929 volunteer hours. \$1,006,439 donated in community service*.

You cleaned parks and handed out flowers to seniors.

You beautified schools and wrote thank you notes to veterans.

You donated pet food for local animal shelters and new pajamas and bedding for children in foster care.

You painted rocks with messages of hope and sewed rice packs to help ease the pain for those fighting cancer.

You picked up trash in your neighborhoods and played bingo and sang karaoke with those living in care homes.

You washed windows and potted plants for teachers.

You made compassion bags for survivors of human trafficking and made teddy bears for children experiencing trauma.

You painted benches and cleaned waterways.

You made blankets for those in hospice and assembled hygiene kits for those experiencing homelessness.

You washed emergency vehicles and planted community gardens.

Of the 270 projects, 127 (or 47%) of those were in low and moderate income level areas.







Over the past 17 years, 67,117 volunteers in Modesto alone have contributed 316,792 hours of service, an investment valued at more than \$10 million in community service.

We do this by offering toolkits, ideas, and even mini grants to help people get started. In six months, 76 mini grants have been awarded.














REFERRAL PROGRAM

Partnering with Child Welfare, we received 663 requests for items this year.

82%

of these requests were successfully found and delivered. The remaining 17% of items not delivered were due to the family finding the item, family not responding, us being unable to locate that item or the case closing.

Love Our Kids seeks to help meet the needs of children and families within the foster care system by making it simple and easy for the community to donate and get involved.

In the spring, we collected new pajamas and bedding as a Love Modesto project. Our goal? To ensure every child receiving a new bed would receive cozy bedding and new pajamas as well.

The community's response was amazing! 215 pairs of pjs, 22 twin comforters, and 50 crib sheets were collected that day!

Senior Portraits

Every year we partner with local photographers who generously give their time and talent to offer free portrait sessions to graduating seniors who are experiencing foster care.

Graduating high school is a milestone for any teen but even more so for those that have had to face all that comes with being in foster care. Helping these teens celebrate this accomplishment is such an inspiring thing.

COMFORT KIT DRIVE

In December we hosted our 8th Annual Comfort Kit Drive. At this event we assembled 1,134 Comfort Kits. The estimated value of these is \$85,050! In addition to this, we put together 80 hygiene kits.

We also collected various items that we were able to give families when needed through our referral program.

STORIES OF IMPACT

At the Comfort Kit Drive, a high school student came up to us to share that he had been in the foster care system. Seeing this many people come together to assemble Comfort Kits because they care about kids like him was so moving to this student. He had no idea this many people cared. He told us he would be back next year and to keep doing this amazing work.

Another woman who attended the Comfort Kit Drive shared how she had grown up and aged out of foster care in Southern California. She was so inspired to see all that we are doing here and wished she had received a comfort kit when she was younger. She had tears in her eyes when we told her how important it is to us that each comfort kit is unique and not mass produced because we want each child to feel seen and valued during such a difficult time. We shared how we also gather household items for youth exiting the program and she confirmed what a huge need this is as it can be so hard starting life as a young adult without a family. This woman said she will be coming to this event each year moving forward in order to give back to kids who are experiencing what she did.

After the Christmas holidays, I was made aware of a 17-year-old male who did not receive any holiday gifts through our Agency. What a thrill it was to have backpacks and a duffle bag a teen boy would probably enjoy. I was able to deliver items to the bay area where the teen is placed and heard back from his aunt that he was so grateful for everything in the bags. The teen would be traveling to Texas to go visit a relative and was dancing around the house with his backpack and duffle bag saying how great he would look in the airport waiting for his plane to arrive. The bags were full of new personal hygiene products, socks, beanie, wallet, gift card, other gift items, and a handmade blanket to use on the plane. It touched my heart as I imagined this almost 6 foot tall 17-year-old dancing around with his blanket and how this gesture of kindness made this teen feel. As a social worker I work with children of all ages and backpacks, comfort bags, blankets, and other gifts you are giving our children are appreciated. It is exciting to look through each new shipment of goodies going to our children. Please know that you are making a difference, and you are all angels during the difficult times.

Love Our Schools is dedicated to building stronger, healthier school campuses for everyone by creating and nurturing strong, supportive bonds within the community. Headed into next year that number has increased to 12.


Have you considered becoming a monthly or annual donor?


